KS1 SATS

There were 5 pupils in Year 2. No pupils sat the KS1 SATs. All of the pupils were working within the P Levels and therefore below the expected standard.

Year 1 Phonics Test.

KS2 SATS

There were 12 pupils in the Year 6 cohort. 6 pupils sat the KS2 SATs, however 0% met the expected standard in reading, writing or maths.

62.5% making more than 2 levels of progress. 75% of our pupils made at least 1 level of progress in reading and 62.5% made at least 2 levels.

Despite there not being many GCSE passes, our pupils have made good progress from their KS2 levels to their end of key stage 4 levels. There were 6, Y11 leavers in Summer 2018. We have data for 4 of them, as 2 joined at different times throughout the key stage. Progress in reading is good as 50% made 2 levels progress over the 2 key stages. Writing progress is excellent as 100% made 2 levels progress and 50% made 3 levels or more. Progress in number is good with 100% making at least one level of progress.
