School was closed for teaching purposes on March 23rd due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This caused considerable disruption to the education of our pupils and may continue to affect their academic and personal development in the 2020-2021 school year. Consider the potential impact of this disruption and detail any planned changes or mitigation measures to curriculum planning and delivery.

Area of impact	Planned changes
Curriculum	Pupils will complete a wellbeing unit on how covid-19 has affect individuals, families and communities. Pupils to recap prior learning missed due to covid-19. Pupils will also discuss and investigate how places of work, public places and transport have adapted to keep people safe and social distanced around the pandemic.
Lesson content	Safety in the workplace, safety around others, safety in public areas and using public transport. Covid-19 rules around international travel and how countries are working to limit infection rates through quarantine and limited travel and flight paths. Year 11 pupils to study career management which formed the later part of the Year 10 curriculum.
Lesson delivery	All pupils to sit more than one meter apart following social distancing guidelines. Pupils to wash hands at the start and end of the lesson. Pupils to have own work station and own stationary case so there is no cross contamination. Staff to support students from a distance of more than one meter.
Assessment	Books not to be taken home, pupils to complete individual work tasks limiting their contact with others. Assessments to be carried out on a summary sheet completed electronically. Baseline assessments to be completed using progression from March last year.
